Dear Colleagues,

There are so many events going on the world I could comment on – but will restrain myself this month. However, I can confirm again that the **ISUOG World Congress will be on 15 to the 17 October 2021**. Thank you to the many research groups and individuals who have submitted their abstracts.

For many years there have been conversations about ISUOG events being made more accessible. This year I am delighted the Trustees have approved a very significant change in the pricing of the meeting for colleagues from low resource countries.

Registration this year for ISUOG members from these countries will be £20 pounds for early bird, in line with ISUOG's charitable mission to improve women's health around the world. I really hope this makes attending an ISUOG World Congress more accessible. We also have plans to tailor some content specifically to low resource settings. More details on this will be available soon.
