


THE 2022 HYBRID MODEL

The 2022 Congress was ISUOG's first ever hybrid event, with over 850 onsite participants in London and more than 2000 joining us virtually from around the world. This new format allowed us to offer our delegates the opportunity to register as an onsite or virtual-only attendee. This way, the full onsite program could be accessible for those in low and middle income countries who would not usually be able to attend an in-person Congress.







The Congress program

The scientific program spanned 3 days and showcased cutting-edge research from leading experts in ultrasound in obstetrics and gynecology.

With over 45 hours of lectures, workshops, masterclasses and scans offered to both onsite and virtual delegates, this Congress was packed full of interesting content and important clinical updates from our international faculty.

Onsite delegates were also offered an exciting social program including a complimentary welcome reception on day 1 and a Congress party at the Swan Underglobe.











