ISUOG World Congress 2026 overview



The 2025 ISUOG World Congress was held at the **Cancun Center** in Cancun, Mexico. With over 2,130 attendees in total, ISUOG has been delighted to bring back the Congress in the Americas after 10 years.

The Cancun Center provided a conducive space for delegates, speakers and exhibitors to **connect** with each other easily.

The event began with two **pre-Congress courses** on 13 September, followed by the 4-day Congress which showcased **cutting-edge research**, delivered by and for leaders in the field.

Delegates also had further opportunities to network at the **welcome reception** in the Exhibition Hall and the **Congress party** at Harry's Cancun.

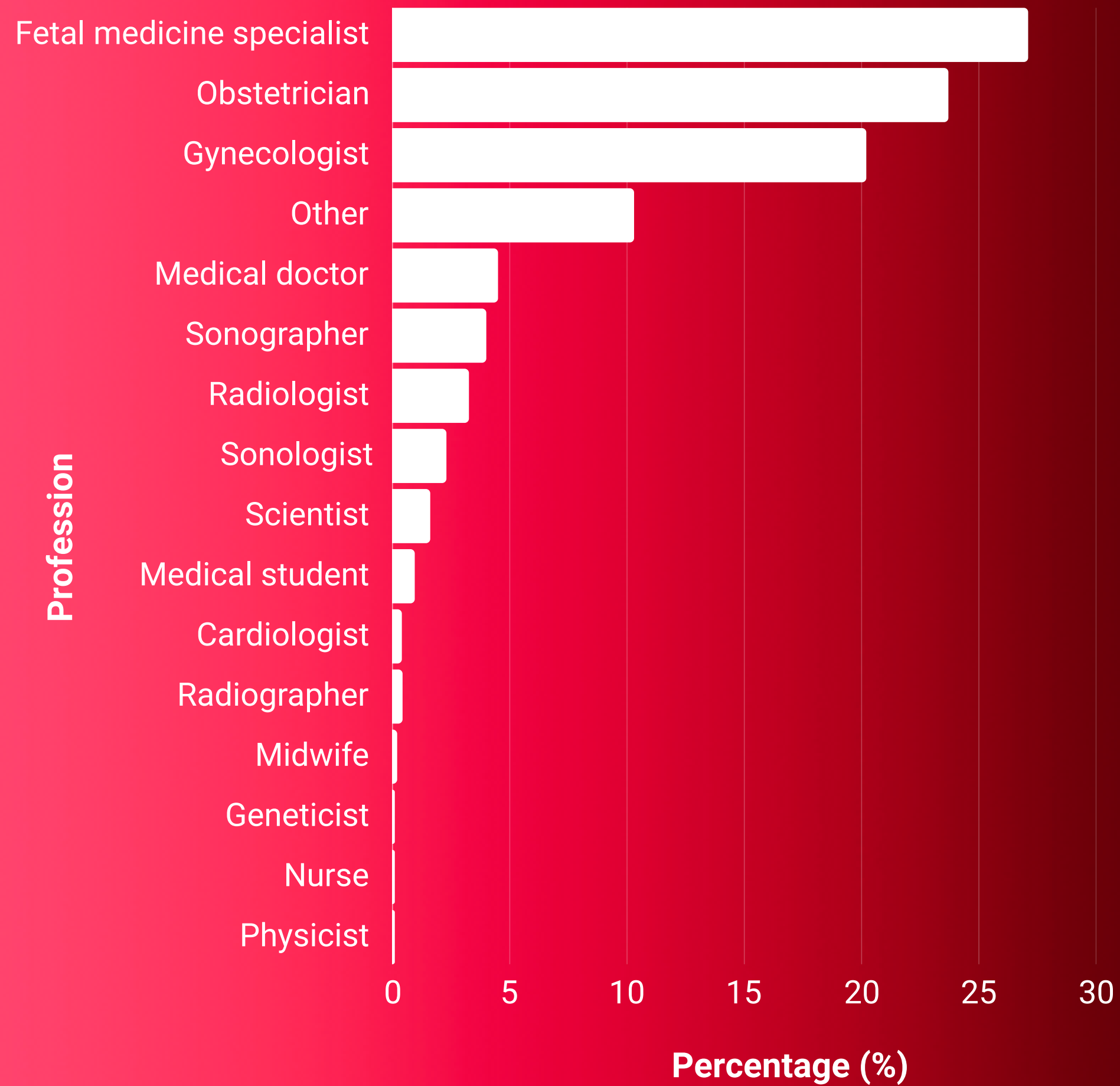

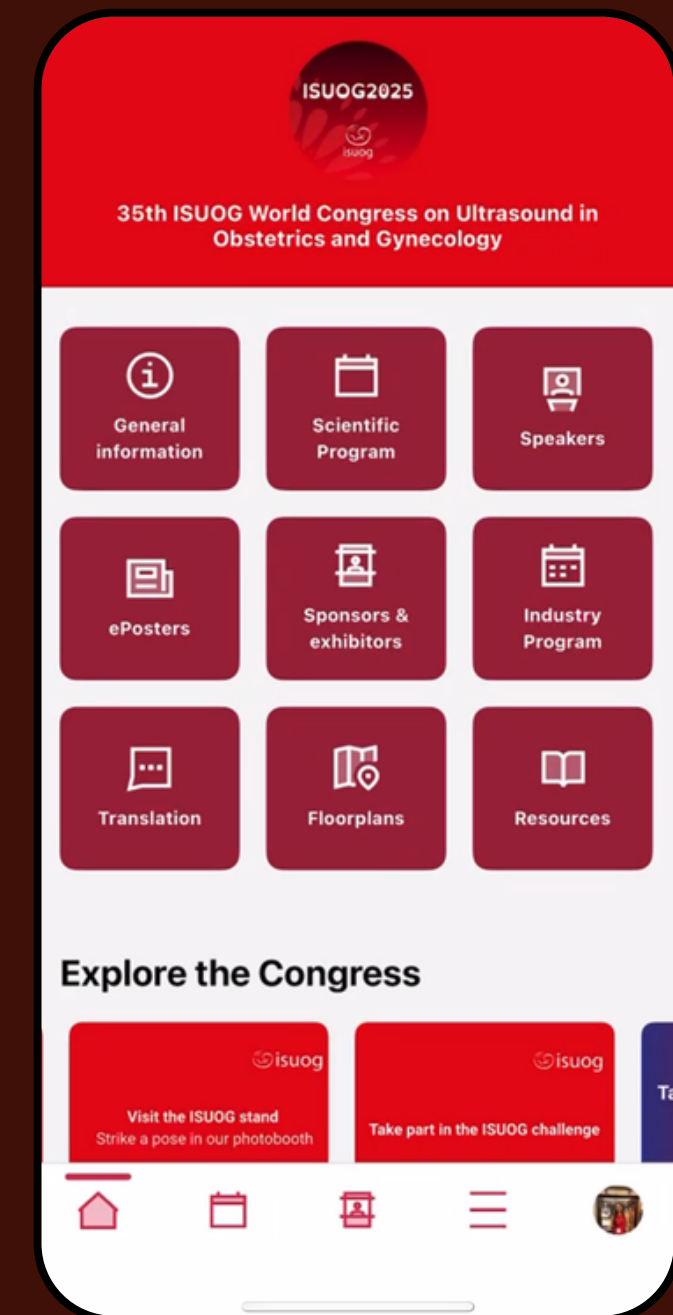

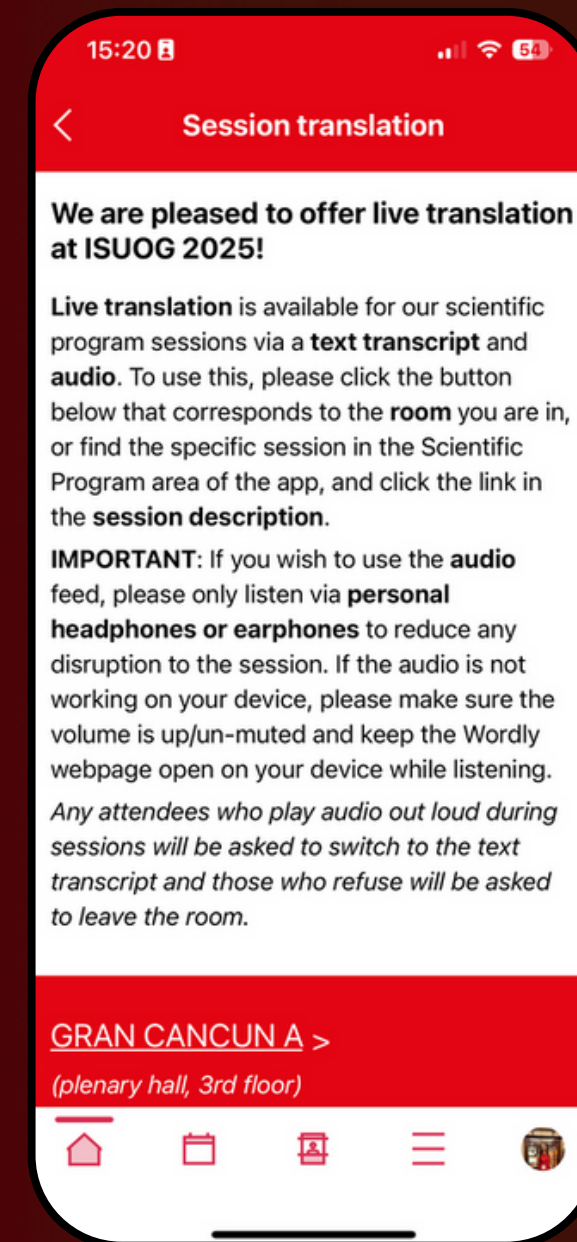
