



ISUOG World Congress 2026 overview



The 2025 ISUOG World Congress was held at the **Cancun Center** in Cancun, Mexico. With over 2,130 attendees in total, ISUOG has been delighted to bring back the Congress in the Americas after 10 years.

The Cancun Center provided a conducive space for delegates, speakers and exhibitors to **connect** with each other easily.

The event began with two **pre-Congress courses** on 13 September, followed by the 4-day Congress which showcased **cutting-edge research**, delivered by and for leaders in the field.

Delegates also had further opportunities to network at the welcome reception in the Exhibition Hall and the Congress party at Harry's Cancun.







Average daily uses across all Congress dates and sessions (not including 13 Sept):




