#### Dear Colleagues,

At the end of the last newsletter I said I had barely mentioned COVID-19. Unfortunately, the last month has seen devastating waves of infection in India and other countries like Uruguay that, up to this point, had somehow seemed to escape the worst of the pandemic. Incredibly, by the beginning of May, almost 1.2 billion doses of vaccine had been given to over 570 million people. However, this translates to only 7% to 8% of the world's population receiving at least one dose and, to date, by far the majority of vaccine doses have been given in just half a dozen countries. We need over 75% of the world to be vaccinated for this pandemic to be controlled.

Moving on to a more positive subject, the ISUOG International Symposium (IS) on the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> April was a great success with 880 delegates attending...[Read the full letter here]


#### COVID-19 resources and guidance Supporting our community

The Miscarriage Matters report
Need for comprehensive reform of
miscarriage care



The Miscarriage Matters report published on 27th April found that existing care for sporadic or recurrent miscarriage is inconsistent and poorly organised worldwide, and a new system is needed to ensure miscarriages are given a high priority and women are given the physical

and mental healthcare they need.

New estimates confirm that miscarriage occurs in 15% of all pregnancies, with one in five women experiencing a miscarriage in their lifetime. The data come from a new three-paper Miscarriage Matters report published by The Lancet with studies from Tommy's National Centre for Miscarriage Research.
