A message from the ISUOG CEO Sarah Johnson



A very warm welcome to the New Year!
As we enter 2019 with ambitious strategic goals for research and education to improve women's health around the world, we are proud to reflect on a record-breaking year for ISUOG, which we owe to all involved in our community.
We ended the year with our highest member numbers ever: over 15,640 members in 140 countries, and the highest impact factor for the [Journal](#). Our [Congress](#) in Singapore achieved the largest audience outside Europe with nearly 2,500 attendees and our best satisfaction scores yet. We were pleased to increase our legacy impact with more than 150 delegates joining the Congress from lower income countries through special fees, travel grants and satellite education, and through our Congress party which supported the local community in Chinatown food street.

Our newly established [China Task Force](#) increased our presence in China, our [Outreach](#) and [Basic Training](#) teams delivered training in Sudan, Haiti, Oman and India, we reached 850 new trainees through 24 partners and our Basic Training curriculum is ready for dissemination in 2019.

We could not achieve this progress without our partners and volunteers. Thank you to all who made this possible and we look forward to welcoming you to our [upcoming events](#) and to working with you in the year ahead.

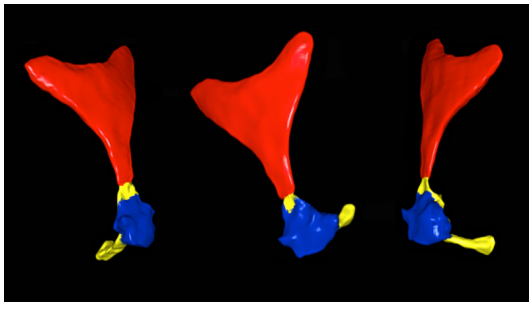


29th World Congress on Ultrasound in Obstetrics and Gynecology

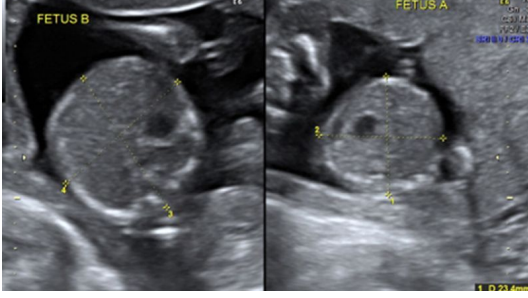
