Also out this month is a <u>new video abstract</u> accompanying a randomized controlled trial of elective delivery vs routine obstetric care in fetal gastroschisis.

In 2020, we will be hosting courses on topics ranging from <u>Modern management of twins</u> to <u>Fetal Echocardiography</u> and the <u>State of the art</u> <u>Ultrasound in pregnancy</u>, and much more. Hosted jointly with SMFM, the <u>Modern</u> <u>Management in Twins</u> course will take place in February and can be attended on site in Dallas (USA) or via <u>live stream</u>. We will also be hosting the <u>Fetal Echocardiography</u> course in London on 21-22 February. The course will include clinical discussions, case studies and theoretical lectures.



This November, Basic Training returned to Colombia for part two of our course in Medellin in partnership with Fundared Materna and FECOPEN. The course was a huge success, with 60 delegates onsite and over 100 delegates from 6 satellites attending 2 days of theoretical lectures. 30 residents stayed on for a further two days practical training, where they were taught how to perform the ob/gyn ultrasound scan with the help of 7 instructors and 70 volunteer patients. At the end of the course, 5 delegates chose to take a certification assessment, and received their certificates of completion of Basic Training! Hear from the Top Abstract and Young Investigator- Gynecology winner from ISUOG2019, Christopher Kyriacou



My research began at Queen Charlotte's and Chelsea Hospital in London, working under the supervision of Professor Tom Bourne and his team in Early Pregnancy, investigating the mechanisms and consequences of early pregnancy complications. My focus is risk prediction in Pregnancy of Unknown Location (PUL) and diagnostics in Ectopic Pregnancy (EP). For women these can be both lifethreatening and traumatic. We aim to optimise current methods of classifying PUL whilst investigating markers that provide superior EP diagnostic capability. Attending ISUOG in 2018 allowed the opportunity to gain knowledge from world leaders and was highly motivating when presenting our exciting novel findings on microRNA in 2019. It means so much to be awarded top abstract and young investigator (gynecology) and am grateful for the opportunity to share our work with international experts in ultrasound.
