Certificate courses

Delegates were given the opportunity to participate in two certificate courses at the Virtual International Symposium. The **Gynecological Imaging Certificate** course and the **Mid Trimester Fetal Ultrasound Certificate** course.

216 delegates took the Mid Trimester Fetal Ultrasound Certificate Course and **75%** of delegates achieved a pass mark of **70%** or above.

212 delegates took the Gynecological Imaging Certificate Course and **72%** of the delegates achieved a pass mark of 70% or above.







Resource Center and case reports

In the Resource Center, delegates were able to participate in the 'Unknowns of the day' challenge, which allowed them to attempt to diagnose difficult cases and then review the actual diagnoses and discussion points.
