It is with great sadness that we report the passing of Jean Hollingsworth on the 15<sup>th</sup> April 2020. Jean was the first ultrasound superintendent in Obstetrics at the historic Queen Charlotte's hospital in London, arriving in 1984 to develop the service. Jean was also involved in supporting Professor Charles Rodeck who set up the first fetal medicine unit at the hospital in 1986. Jean is remembered for her sharp wit and generosity of spirit, and most of all for being a skilled mentor and teacher. Jean taught clinicians and sonographers alike with an uncompromising approach towards technical excellence and patient care. She advanced the field of obstetric scanning and improved the craft of all under her leadership.
