Session types explained

Accepted abstracts may be presented in the following ways:

Oral communication (OC)

Presented within the main sessions, OC abstract authors are allocated 5 minutes for their presentation (of no more than 5 slides), plus 3 minutes for discussion.

Short oral presentation (OP)

OP abstract authors are allocated 2 minutes to orally present their poster (1 slide only), plus 2 minutes for discussion.

Poster discussions (P)

Poster discussions take place in the Hubs. These are intimate, flexible and friendly spaces designated to offer the author the opportunity to meet delegates interested in their research, discuss any comments and answer questions on their work.

Electronic posters (EP)

Abstracts accepted as view only posters are available for viewing throughout the Congress on the On Demand stations located at the ISUOG lounge.

All OC, OP, P & EP presentations are published in the abstract book and online.
