Country hosting	Hosting fee	Membership fee *
I. Low resource countries (Hinari list) See appendix 1	Not required, no minimum delegates required	1 year free to trainees £10 membership to non- trainees
II. Middle income countries (not in the Hinari list) See appendix 2	£200 required, includes up to 20 delegates	Additional delegates (whether trainee or non-trainee) above minimum £10 each
III. High income countries See appendix 3	£500 (hosting fee only)	£10 per delegate required in addition if trainees £25 per delegate required in addition if non-trainees

* ISUOG will provide 1 year complimentary ISUOG basic membership for all trainee and non-trainee attendees starting from the time of the course .
