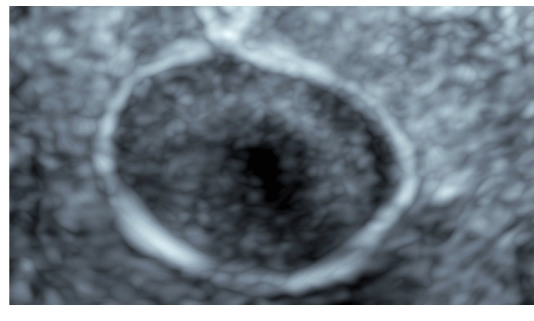

Included are articles on the effectiveness of established and emerging screening methods and their implementation in clinical practice, as well as preventative methods such as pessary or cervical cerclage. An opinion piece by [Shennan](#) discusses some of the relevant articles in this issue in the context of existing literature, highlighting the often conflicting evidence, and advising that more input from the academic community is required to elucidate the subtleties in differing efficacies of both prediction and prevention of PTB.

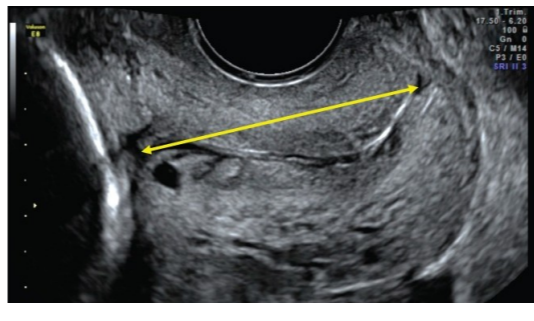
